Chat from the Chair...

There's always a better way

Once upon a time......back in March (was it only March? Hell it seems longer), I promised to expand on what we, as a club are doing, and how we are looking to evolve. I also need to make you aware of a couple of changes.

For those that actually read these ramblings hopefully you will see a theme with each month following on from the previous. If you don't read them and stop here, I can't really help that!

The easy bit - A change

From this month on the committee meeting minutes will not be included within 'Nooze'. Here you will fall into one of two camps; a) the why not camp or b) the couldn't care less camp. Well for those that are interested in the why not, the rationale behind this is simple. Nooze is the club's public facing newsletter and as a result this would allow Members privy information to be public – to say this is far from ideal is an understatement. For that reason, the minutes will be sent as a separate attachment, either to the Nooze email or as a separate email depending on time constraints – Nooze will not be held up for the sake of minutes! Equally, we won't delay in circulating minutes.

The observant amongst you will note that the June driving day, is not a driving day but a trial. The exact details of this are yet to be established and whether any part of the courses will be open for regular driving is dependent on the number of Marshals available.....Read on.

The could be challenging bit – Requests for support and help

Marshals are essential in the running of our events, be it regular club days or off-site activities and as many of you are aware there is a mandatory set of requirements from an IOPD / MSA (our governing bodies) and our insurers. There are others on the committee that know more about this than I do \odot .

What I do know is, it's not optional and in order to continue being able to run the events we MUST meet certain criterion. One of these criteria is for our marshals is to actively participate in a number of events in a given 12-month period in order to remain 'current. Further, there have been several events where we've barely had sufficient marshals to run. We've managed so far but please understand we've been close to having to postpone / cancel some events due to insufficient marshals.

Matt is organising a marshal training session in June, please make every effort to attend this, and the subsequent driving day. We are trying something different as attendance to driving day events has typically been low but I'm keen to make sure no-one is excluded and as such there is something available for everyone. We will communicate further post the Suffolk Show.

Shows are an integral part of the club and typically our shows are 'active' which as many of you know take an inordinate amount of effort from all those that volunteer. These shows are great for the raising of our charity funds but do little for the increasing of our membership and even today, after the club has been around for 29 years we hear – "didn't know you existed" from local fellow land rover enthusiasts.

That, combined with there being a new opportunity for a Static Display at Stonham Barns Land Rover Show later in the year got us thinking about Static Shows and whether we should attend in order to 'promote' the club, both from a charity perspective and with a view to gaining additional members.

That said, we need volunteers for this. James Prentice is taking charge of the Stonham event and establishing a 'Static set-up' to fit in a boot so we don't have to cart the show trailer around.

However, we need volunteers to attend the Framlingham (August) and Henham (Sept) events. Without volunteers we'll have to eat humble pie and say no we can no longer attend. If you are interested, willing and able please get in touch with me directly ASAP.

I think I explained in my first chat – we are all here for a common reason, different varieties of that reason and frankly if we want the club to survive, we have to do something, perhaps many things different......What that something different is we haven't fully worked out yet, let's not try and solve that just now.

If you've got here, well done, keep reading......

The Hard bit – What next / timeline

There are two immediate items that affect what the club looks like and how the club operates;

1) The Site

In respect of the site, thank you again to all the members that helped tidy, clear and fettle the site, it truly is a vast improvement and if we look back it probably wasn't given the attention it deserved in the past. That said, we can make sure we keep on top of such works going forwards.

The next step here is to have the follow up meeting with our landlords towards the end July / beginning of August. We will be sure to keep you updated post this meeting.

2) Club finances

You will be aware that as a club we have two significant primary costs before we get into the day to day running costs, that of the site rent and our insurance.

Today, our membership subscriptions do not cover our baseline costs and as a result we rely on 'event income' to top-up the accounts.

We are looking closely at the 'year-on-year' costs and you will see we've put a finance review in for July to establish our position in terms of predicted finances for the year and whether the forecast for the financial year looks sustainable.

You will remember last month I spoke about reviewing and renewing our insurance, this did result in a saving of approx. £250 by taking out 'unused events'. The way the insurance works is simple – each event has a cost associated with it. As a VERY rough guide if we half the events, we half the insurance (excluding broker fees and tax etc).....Ummm, brain ticking over here.

We are continuing to review the charity event running costs which can be accurately and justifiably apportioned to the charity monies raised in order to ensure members are not 'propping up' the charity events. This has to be auditable and justifiable for obvious reasons. Equally, we cannot use charity funds to 'top-up' and fund the clubs site rent unless of course we happen to hold a specific event at the site for the benefit of our charities......brain going into overdrive now!!

Herein, is the immediate timeline which along with the two key items above (which drive what happens next), starts to show what happens behind the scenes and hence we need volunteers, we need members to come forward, show interest, attend events and help.


We'll continue to evolve this going forwards. With that said, it's been another one of those days where I now need to catch up with the day's work!!

Marshal Training Day

June 10th at Newbourne

At the very heart of the Suffolk Land Rover Owners club are our experienced and invaluable Marshals who enable us to continue to run events safely – simply put, without Marshals our events do NOT run!

To ensure that we can continue to run events, and have adequate coverage over the whole year, we need to increase the number of qualified Marshals that we have in the club.

To that end, we are holding a **Marshal Training Course** on **10**th **June** and would invite both members who have been Marshals before (but qualification has lapsed), and members who have never taken the step to learn what it's all about!

The Marshal course covers many aspects of our club operation and also Driving and Safety, including safe Winch use - key topics covered are:

- Roles of the Marshal & Clerk of Course
- Safety inspection of vehicles (scrutineering)
- Recovery equipment and procedures
- Winch operation and safety overview for recoveries
- Driver education Off-road driving techniques

The course covers some great theory items in the form of classroom/presentation work, and then the main bulk of the day is practical - putting into action everything covered in the classroom, including undertaking safe recoveries, and performing some driving on the courses.

The course will run from **10:00** to around **15:00**, and if you're camping over, you will have the opportunity to use your newly learned skills the following day.

There will be **NO** charge for this training, and as others can testify from previous courses held, there is a lot of valuable things to learn during the day, so it's well worth while – you're guaranteed to learn something new and useful!
